### Sri Lanka Standard GUIDE FOR POSITIONING OF LABELS IN GARMENTS

#### **FOREWORD**

This standard was approved by the Sectoral Committee on Textiles, Clothing and Leather and was authorized for adoption and publication as a Sri Lanka Standard by the Council of the Sri Lanka Standards Institution on 1996-10-17.

On garments it is necessary that the information regarding care labelling, the size of garment and other information be given on the labels. The positioning of labels is equally important so as to convey the information without causing much inconvenience to the user of a garment. But as a variety of garments made to different users and end-uses with number of designs and patterns is available, labels in the form of main labels, size labels, care labels or informative labels may be positioned varyingly.

As garments are highly customer-oriented, it has been the practice in the industry that the labels are placed in positions as agreed to between interested parties, basically on buyer's instructions. Apart from that the positions selected in the garments for labelling, especially the main labels should be in prominent places which could be readily seen outside after the garment is packed. This standard guide which prescribes labelling positions of garments currently in practice would assist both users and suppliers to maintain uniformity in labeling of garments.

#### 1 SCOPE

This standard describes the positioning of labels in garments

#### 2 REFERENCE

**SLS 335** Code for care labelling of textiles using symbols.

#### **3 REQUIREMENTS**

- 3.1 The labels on garments shall not be visible from outside and inconvenient to the wearer. They shall be easy to find and not hidden away which would otherwise lead to difficulties in conveying information.
- **3.2** The symbols and letters on the labels shall always be legible.
- 3.3 The labels for each article unless otherwise agreed to between the purchaser and the supplier shall be positioned as given in 4.

#### **NOTE**

- 1 It is not always possible to have only one label due to the type of manufacture, material and fashion requirements of the garments. Therefore, it is permitted to have other information on a second label positioned along side the main label or as prescribed in 4.
- 2 Main label may carry information with respect to material composition, size of garment, brand name, if any etc. and other information including care labelling may be in the second label.
- 3 Size label denoting the size of garment in units or by letters like XL, L, M, S or else may either be with or incorporated into the main label or the second label.
- 3.3.1 When an article comprises of two or more parts, each part should carry labels.
- 3.3.2 Labels carrying any information with respect to care labelling shall be in compliance with the requirements given in SLS 335.

#### SRI LANKA STANDARDS INSTITUTION

The Sri Lanka Standards Institution (SLSI) is the National Standards Organization of Sri Lanka established under the Sri Lanka Standards Institution Act No. 6 of 1984 which repealed and replaced the Bureau of Ceylon Standards Act No. 38 of 1964. The Institution functions under the Ministry of Science & Technology.

The principal objects of the Institution as set out in the Act are to prepare standards and promote their adoption, to provide facilities for examination and testing of products, to operate a Certification Marks Scheme, to certify the quality of products meant for local consumption or exports and to promote standardization and quality control by educational, consultancy and research activity.
